— Discuss.

- (a) Comment critically on Macbeth's character as revealed in his soliloquies.
- (b) Banquo dead is dramatically as important as alive. Do you support? Answer with appropriate illustrations from the text.
- (c) Write an essay on the significance of magic and fairies in *A Midsummer Night's*.
- (d) How are the characters of Hermia and Helena contrasted in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*?

3. Answer **any two** questions : 5×2=10
- (a) Assess Cynewulf as an Old English religious poet with reference to 'The Fates of the Apostles'.
- (b) Write a short note on *Ancrene Riwe*.
- (c) Write a note on any one of the Scottish Chaucerians.
- (d) Comment Critically on *Gorboduc*.

- (h) How would you distinguish between a simile and a metaphor?
- (i) Scan the following and mention the dominant metrical pattern with variations, if any:
- The land's sharp feature seemed to be
- The century's corpse outleant.
- (j) Define a pyrrhic foot.

- (b) Assess the contribution of Ben Jonson as an Elizabethan dramatist.

4. Answer **any five** questions : 2×5=10

- (a) What though the field be lost? All is not lost"-What, according to the speaker, is "not lost"?
- (b) How is Satan's shield described in *Milton's Paradise Lost*?
- (c) "That Shepherd, who first taught the chosen seed"-Who was "That Shepherd" and who were the "chosen seed"?
- (d) "To do aught good never will be our task"-What aspect of the speaker's character is revealed in this line?
- (e) "This Nymph, to the Destruction of Mankind, Nourish'd two locks"-How are the "two locks" of Belinda described?
- (f) "Or as Ixion fix'd, the wretch shall feel"-Who is Ixion? Who is referred to as "the watch"?
- (g) Define the rhetorical figure chiasmus with an example.

4. Answer **any five** questions : 2×5=10

- (a) "Whoa!" quod the Knight, "Good sir, no more of this" - What does the speaker mean by 'this' here? What does he demand instead of 'this'?
- (b) "...let baser things devize/ To dy in dust, but you shall live by fame" - When did the speaker say this? Give the meaning of "baser things".
- (c) "Thou, sun, art half as happy as we" - Why is the sun "half as happy as we"?
- (d) "O fearful meditation!" - What "fearful meditation" is referred to here?
- (e) "Even so, being full of your ne'er-cloying sweetness, / To bitter sauces did I frame my feeding" - Give the meanings of "ne'er-cloying sweetness" and "bitter sauces".
- (f) "When our actions do not, / Our fears do make us traitors" — Who says this and in which context?
- (g) "The night is long that never finds the day" - Comment briefly.

- (h) "Apollo flies, and Daphne holds the chase" - What does the speaker imply by this line?
- (i) What mistake does Puck commit in the application of the love-potion? What are the consequences of his mistake?
- (j) "And therefore is winged Cupid painted blind" - What explanation does the speaker give for Cupid being painted blind?
