- b) Examine the role of the elements in *The Tempest*.
- c) How does Shakespeare's Twelfth Night question, challenge, and to a major extent, subvert heteronormative ideology? Elucidate with reference to the text.
- d) By subverting established conventions of socialisation, Shakespeare's Twelfth Night majorly challenges heteropatriarchal standards and stereotypes. Elucidate with reference to the text.

2. Answer *any one* of the following questions:

- a) Measure for Measure is profoundly concerned with the themes of justice, mercy and morality. Discuss.
- b) Lucio depicts Vincentio as '...the old fantastical duke of dark corners...' Analyse the character of the Duke in the light of the above observation.
- c) 'Frequently throughout Shakespeare's sonnets the poet/speaker criticises himself for his inadequacy.' Discuss with close reference to the sonnets prescribed in your syllabus.
- d) Comment on the strain of melancholy in Shakespeare's sonnets with reference to the sonnets prescribed in your syllabus.

- d) 'O, you should not rest/ Between the elements of air and earth/ But you should pity me' - Contextualise Cesario's observation to Olivia.
- e) 'What's open made to justice, / That justice seizes. What knows the laws /That thieves do pass on thieves?' Comment.
- f) 'Because authority, though it err like others, /Hath yet a kind of medicine in itself / That skins the vice o'th'top.' Explain.
- g) Explain with reference to the context the significance of the following lines:

Neither in inward worth nor outward fair,

h) Explain with reference to the context the significance of the following lines:'Thus have I had thee as a dream doth flatter:
